

DRIVE FISHERS

116TH STREET RESURFACING & PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Drive Fishers is the City of Fishers' initiative to increase travel efficiency, improve connectivity and maintain the sanitary sewer and water infrastructure via innovative projects and a proactive approach to construction and maintenance.

Since 2012, Fishers has completed traffic calming projects, sanitary and storm sewer projects, 29 resurfaced lane miles of streets, installed 6.5 miles of trails and sidewalks, and received more than \$60 million in grants, improving the infrastructure in Fishers while leveraging federal dollars to save money for the Fishers' taxpayers.

Infrastructure improvement projects contribute to the long-term vitality of our community and increased economic development opportunities.

PROJECT SCOPE

Beginning in 2017, 116th Street will be rehabilitated from the western most border of Fishers, just east of Eller Road, to the I-69 interchange. This project will include the resurfacing and striping of 116th Street including removal of all current concrete crosswalks which will be replaced by traditional "piano key" white striped crosswalks. ADA compliant pedestrian ramps will also be installed for easier pedestrian access off of all crosswalks.

This project will increase the ease of travel along 116th Street, while providing increased connectivity and pedestrian safety. Additional details about this project will be shared in weekly construction updates and on the Drive Fishers Twitter account.
