



FALL CREEK TRAIL

Drive Fishers is the City of Fishers' initiative to increase travel efficiency, improve connectivity and maintain the sanitary sewer and water infrastructure via innovative projects and a proactive approach to construction and maintenance.

Since 2012, Drive Fishers has completed traffic calming projects, sanitary and storm sewer projects, 29 resurfaced lane miles, 6.5 trails and sidewalks, and received more than \$20 million in grants, improving the infrastructure in Fishers while leveraging federal dollars to save money for the Fishers' taxpayers.

Infrastructure improvement projects contribute to long-term vitality of our community and increased economic development opportunities.

PROJECT SCOPE

The Fall Creek Road multi-use path is an important transportation and recreation connection not only for local residents but also as a link to Indianapolis and neighborhoods beyond the Geist area. The current configuration consists of narrow concrete sidewalks, aging boardwalks and timber bridge deck, and concrete slabs. This project involves the reconstruction of the path into a wider, more accessible multi-use trail that is capable of meeting the public's needs of both today and tomorrow.

Upon construction, the trail will be replaced with a 10-foot wide asphalt trail, and will include nine street crossings that currently consist of unmarked crosswalks. Not only will this project improve connectivity and recreation opportunities, but it will also improve ADA-accessibility and pedestrian safety.
