



NICKEL PLATE TRAIL AMENITIES

Drive Fishers is the City of Fishers' initiative to increase travel efficiency, improve connectivity and maintain the sanitary sewer and water infrastructure via innovative projects and a proactive approach to construction and maintenance.

Since 2012, Drive Fishers has completed traffic calming projects, sanitary and storm sewer projects, 29 resurfaced lane miles, 6.5 trails and sidewalks, and received more than \$20 million in grants, improving the infrastructure in Fishers while leveraging federal dollars to save money for the Fishers' taxpayers.

Infrastructure improvement projects contribute to long-term vitality of our community and increased economic development opportunities.

PROJECT SCOPE

The City of Fishers is committed to creating a vibrant downtown district where residents can enjoy outdoor recreation, alternate means of transportation, and amenities that make it easy to explore all the Nickel Plate District that has to offer. With the support of a federal grant, the City of Fishers is adding benches, trash cans, bike racks, drinking fountains, trail signage and markings along the Nickel Plate Trail from 106 Street through the Municipal Complex.

This project totals at \$729,000, which will be paid for primarily through federal funds. The City of Fishers will pay \$361,000 in total for this project. Installation of amenities has begun and is slated for completion by June 2016.
