

DRIVE FISHERS

ALLISONVILLE ROAD WIDENING PROJECT

Drive Fishers is the City of Fishers' initiative to increase travel efficiency, improve connectivity, and maintain the sanitary sewer and water infrastructure via innovative projects and a proactive approach to construction and maintenance.

Since 2012, Drive Fishers has completed traffic calming projects, sanitary and storm sewer projects, 53 resurfaced lane miles, 11 miles of trails and sidewalks, and received more than \$60 million in grants, improving the infrastructure in Fishers while leveraging federal dollars to save money for the Fishers' taxpayers.

Infrastructure improvement projects contribute to long-term vitality of our community and increased economic development opportunities. PROJECT SCOPE

This project will widen Allisonville Road to four lanes, two northbound lanes and two southbound lanes, from the bridge at Smock Creek to approximately the River Highlands Drive intersection, while also providing left turn lanes onto Orchard Boulevard and River Highlands Drive. This will include a curb and gutter section, along with a new storm sewer system.

In addition, 10 foot trails will be added to each side of the roadway to connect to the existing trail network north and south of this project. New lighting will also be installed along the roadway.

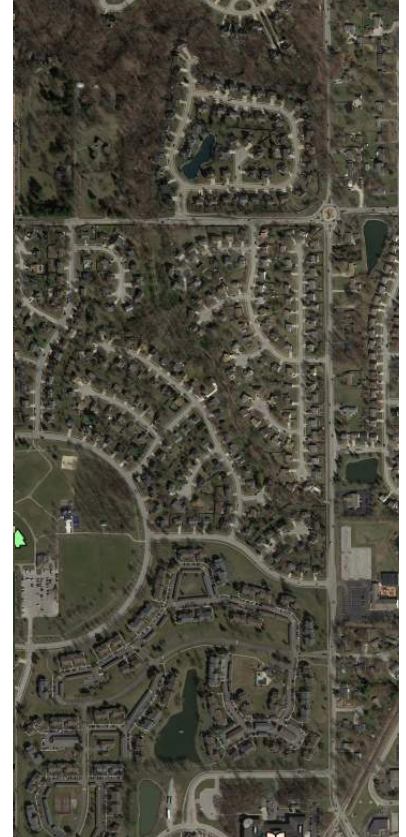
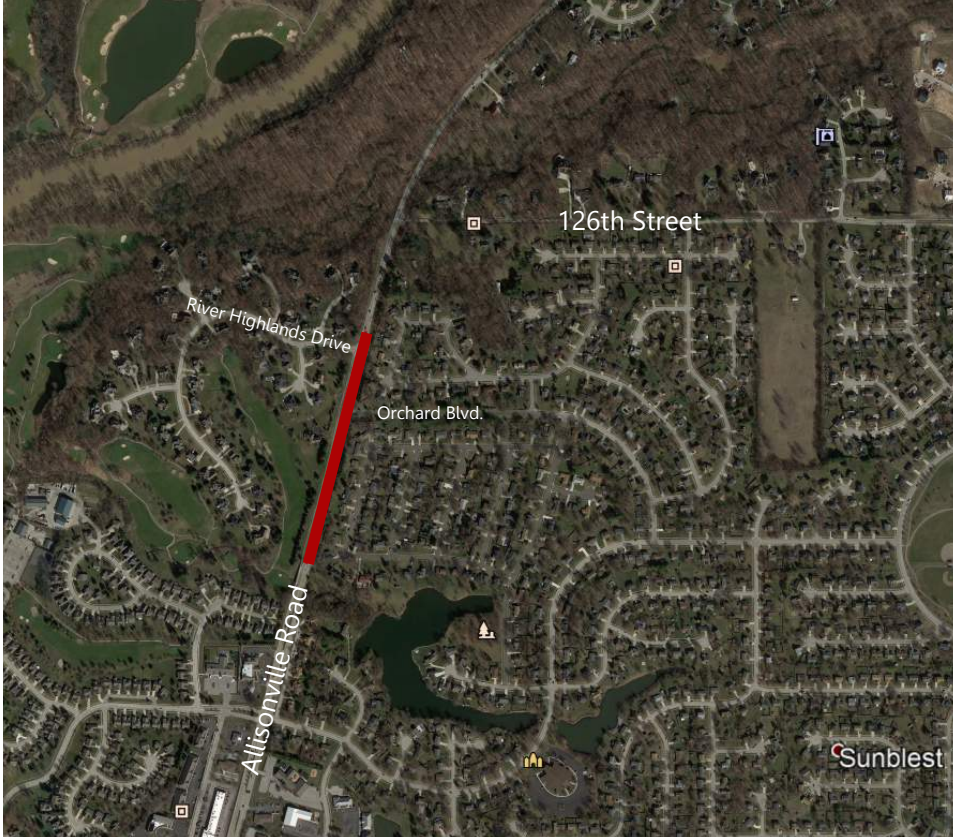
