Fishers Fire Station 97 - Built and Fully Staffed
Fishers Police - 3 additional Police Officers

With an approved 2022 budget, the City of Fishers will complete and fully staff the new Fishers Fire and Emergency Services Station 97 to serve the northeast portion of the city. Additionally, Fishers Police Department will hire three additional officers, bringing the total to 123 serving the community.

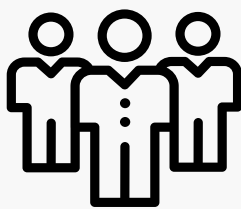
